



Lost Cat Checklist

Don't let your out-of-control emotions prevent you from forgetting something important! Print out this checklist and mark off each suggestion as you complete it. Hopefully your cat will be returned to you safe and sound in no time!

- Check Your own Garden and outside property First**
Indoor cats who slip out will usually stay in their own gardens, or hide under decking, foundations, and shrubbery.

- Create Flyers with a Photo of the Cat**
Offer a reward, and distribute the flyers door-to-door in at least a three street radius, also post in store/shop windows and on telephone poles.

- Ask your Animal Control Officer (if available via organisations such as the RSPCA)**
Give him/her a flyer and ask that s/he be on the lookout for your cat, dead or alive.

- Call Local Veterinarians**
It is possible a "guardian angel" brought your cat in with injuries; ask the vets if you can post a flyer in their clinics.

- Visit your Local Animal Shelter**
Leave a flyer and ask if a cat meeting the description has been brought in, alive or dead.

- Enlist Neighbourhood people**
Visit your local neighbours and ask that they keep their eyes (and ears) open for information about your cat; hand out flyers.

- Advertise**
Most local newspapers and shopping guides will allow free "lost & found" adverts. Also Check the newspaper listing for "found cats".

- Post to Local Lost/Found Internet Pages**
Some local communities sponsor web sites specifically designed for lost/missing pets.
